

- 3 Purple Cope - The Rector is hoping to purchase a purple cope for use in Advent, Lent and at funerals. A parishioner has already given a donation and if anyone else wishes to give a donation please put it in an envelope clearly marked 'Purple Cope' and hand to either the Churchwardens, Treasurer or Rector. If you can "Gift Aid" your donation, then that will greatly help. (Gift Aid envelopes are available in Church.) The cope will cost about £500.

- 4 The Clypping Service - This year the Clypping Service - the unique service to Edmond - will take place on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> July. This will be the 150<sup>th</sup> Celebration of The Clypping.



But please note that the time has had to be changed from 3:00pm (as stated in the Parish Magazine) TO 2:00pm.

This is because our preacher Bishop Mark needs to be in Somerset in the evening.

- 6 On Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> June the Rector will celebrate Holy Communion at St Peter's at 9:30am to observe the Birth of John the Baptist, which is also the anniversary of his own Ordination. We also remember all clergy, past and present, ordained around this time and for those being ordained this year.
