

7 Friends of St Peter's Church - The Friends of St Peter's was set up to assist St Peter's to fulfil its duty of worship and to contribute to the repair, maintenance, improvement of, and additions to the fabric, furnishings; and also, to promote and support any charitable activities calculated to preserve and beautify the Church, its history and its magic. You may recall that it has organised several concerts and held a St Peter's Week festival in the church. We now need to appoint a new chairperson to replace Dr Julia Brown, who has moved to France, also a new secretary to replace Mrs Stephanie Egleston. The work is not too demanding, and the positions are open to anyone in the parish; you do not have to be a churchgoer, just someone who would like to help support St Peter's Church. If anyone is willing to take on either of these roles please speak to the Rector or Churchwardens.
