

Considering it was ill supported in respect of the buying element of a Bring and Buy, the total raised is quite respectable I think.

The Newport Male Voice Choir held the first concert of their 75th year at St. Peter's on Friday 16th February. It was a great night and they enticed and entranced us with everything from South Africa to Sinatra. Also, to Jane and Keith Norton for the mammoth 'washinupathon' they did to help in the kitchen. We raised £311 of which £161 is profit for the Friends of St. Peters Organ Appeal, and the remainder was the fee to the choir. Next event will be New College Chorale on Saturday 21st April at 7.30 pm. We look forward to this extremely popular choir entertaining us once more at St. Peters.
